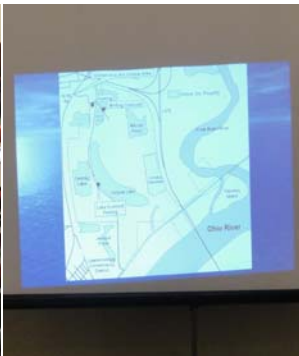


After the presentation we will have a hot lunch prepared by Mike Houston. Lorraine Loomans is receiving reservations.
